SDUIS ESL instructors will be traveling and living in Londrina, south of Brazil, to teach English as a Second Language to 60 abandoned children from a local orphanage. SDUIS educators are looking forward to leading this new and exciting program at the "Lar Analia Franco". They believe that their time and expertise will help make a difference in their own lives and someone else's. " Lar Analia Franco is the home of 80 orphans ages 5-18. Portuguese is the language spoken in Brazil, the largest country in South America. International businesses and tourism require employees who speak English, which is hard to find. English as a Second Language training is available through private education, accessible only to those with financial resources.

San Diego University for Integrative Studies (SDUIS) is a small, private University whose programs center on integrating the mind, body and spirit approach to psychology and business. Daniela Versari, the Director of the SDUIS English as a Second Language Program said "many of these children are not adopted and remain at the orphanage until age 18 when they are on their own. Providing them with

additional skills will empower them and improve their chances in life."
